While on active duty within the Royal Australian Navy, Mark served at sea and ashore in the Chaplaincy Branch, including time in the Persian Gulf during the 2003 Iraq War and in Banda Aceh and Nias following the 2004 Boxing Day tsunami.

Mark also has a Doctorate of Theology, with his thesis examining the theological, historical and philosophical roots of the Holocaust.
