Nicki has a Masters degree in Bioethics from the Centre for Human Bioethics, and published a first class Honours Law thesis on the regulation of IVF in Victoria.

As a solicitor at Corrs Nicki advised and acted for patients, health care networks, medical practitioners, nurses and allied health care professionals, medical defence funds, private health insurers in matters in the Supreme Court, the Magistrates' Court, VCAT and before the Medical Board of Victoria.

At MOLS Nicki provided practical, resolution based advice on planning applications, residential tenancy and neighbourhood disputes, privacy issues, mental health issues, sale of goods complaints and traffic matters.

Nicki is also a Nationally Accredited Mediator and is available to mediate across all areas of civil and family law.
